
The 2024-25 Big and Little Brother of the Year Honor was awarded to Big Brother Jeff Gage and Little Brother Jax at our November Gala.

2024: A Year of Partnerships

Community partners helped raise \$47,772 for YBBBS with Dutch Brothers raising \$9,545.63 on Bucks for Kids Day in September. Fiesta Bowl Charities and Blue Cross Blue Shield Arizona supported our agency with a full remodel of one of our spaces and turned it into a Community and Mentorship Room.

Other partnerships came in the form of sponsorships which YBBBS saw an increase of over 33% from 2023. Among our valued partners we would like to highlight Desert Financial Credit Union who has not only supported us in grants, sponsorships, and employee donation matching, they also surprise gifted us \$8,500 plus equipment/tech.

Employer matching came in over \$20,000. We saw a 33% INCREASE in Sponsorships over 2023.
